

Registration Information

- Adult Education courses and programs for high school credit are open to students 18 years of age or older who are not registered in a secondary school.
- Current transcript, photo identification and citizenship status are required to register.

Prior Learning Assessment & Recognition (PLAR) for Mature Students



What is PLAR?

Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) is the formal evaluation and credit granting process whereby mature students may obtain credits for prior learning. Prior learning includes the knowledge and skills that adults have gained, in both formal and informal ways, outside of secondary school.

The PLAR process for mature students involves:

- 1. Individual Assessment/Equivalency (Grade 9/10 credits)
- 2. Equivalency (Grade 11/12 credits)

Who can apply for a PLAR Assessment?

A mature student who is:

- 1. Turning 18 before August 31st of the current school year
- 2. Enrolled in a credit program for the purpose of obtaining an Ontario Secondary School Diploma

What supports are available for PLAR?

- 1. Students who register in a credit course or program can request to meet with a Guidance Counsellor to have a credit assessment.
- Students who need help to prepare for the Grade 9/10 PLAR assessments can receive support from the Adult Upgrading (Literacy and Basic Skills) Program or register for the Fast Track Program to gain the knowledge and skills needed to earn Equivalency credits.

Is there a cost?

There is no cost for the PLAR Assessment once a student is registered in a credit course or program.

"I am 54 years old and I've been out of school for almost 40 years. I have always wanted to get my high school diploma. I've looked into it over the years, talked to a few people, but it's never been the right time. After speaking to the PLAR assessor, she made me believe that I could do it. After discussions with her, I dove in, completed my first course and I feel better than I've felt in years. I couldn't have done any of this without the staff at Archbishop Anthony Meagher CCEC." — Kim

Fast Track

The Fast Track program is designed for adult learners 18 years of age or older and out of school who are interested in strengthening their academic skills and completing their high school diploma. Fast Track provides a supportive learning environment and intake process, with welcoming staff who can provide help with pathways planning and support the mature PLAR process.

Students will receive supports to:

- Complete 1 credit (GLE3O/GLE4O or GLS4O)
- Build skills required to successfully complete Mature PLAR assessments
- · Be assessed for life and work experiences for grade 11 and 12 credits
- Plan for College, Apprenticeship, Work or University
- Complete extra credits using Independent Study course materials

Students who register in day school programs will need:

- High School transcript or status sheet
- One piece of photo ID and Citizenship status

English for the Workplace Program

Ajax Campus

Are you a Canadian Language Benchmark (CLB) Level 6 or higher student? The English for the Workplace Program helps improve newcomer adults' English skills to prepare for their high school diploma (Ontario Secondary School Diploma), workplace, and/or postsecondary education. Students will build their English skills through a number of topics including business writing and communication, customer service, job search, resume writing, interview skills, managing information, and more.

Eligibility

- Must be 18 years of age or older;
- Completed an English language assessment at CLB Level 6 or higher in Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing or;
- Completed a LINC or ESL course at CLB Level 6 or higher in Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing

Program Details (Monday – Friday):

Students begin the program in the Ontario Literacy Course (OLC30 or 40) After completion of the course, the teacher will provide each student with a recommendation for their next course, which may include continuation in OLC30, OLC40, or other day school credit courses.

Students can begin the program in any of the following semesters:

Semester 1: September 8 – November 8 Semester 2: November 10 – January 23 Semester 3: January 25 – April 4 Semester 4: April 6 – June 8 Semester 5: June 9 – June 28

Registration: Students interested in registering for correspondence courses are required to show photo ID, proof of Canadian Citizenship or Permanent Resident Card (PR Card) and an updated school transcript or status sheet. Full time high school students are not eligible for correspondence courses unless they provide a letter of permission from their home school Principal.

Night School Cooperative Education

A two-credit cooperative education program will be offered at night school to allow students to earn credits through placements in the community that are scheduled during evening hours. This is available to students who:

- Are currently enrolled in day school and are 16 years of age or older;
- Are returning students who wish to complete their OSSD; or
- Require a 2 credit co-op to fulfill the requirements of a SHSM program.

Note: This program requires an application. Please see your guidance counsellor for more information.

Interdisciplinary Course for Athletes

This course is designed for elite student athletes who are participating in an athletic endeavour and wish to obtain an NCAA scholarship. They will earn an Interdisciplinary credit IDP3O1 or IDP4O1 preparing them for the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) or American College Test (ACT).

Registration

Students currently attending high school are asked to see their Guidance Counsellor to register. Students not currently attending high school can visit our Night School webpage to complete the application form with Photo ID and Birth Certificate or proof of Canadian Citizenship/ Permanent Residency and a copy of an up-to-date transcript or status sheet.

What is the Young Parent School Program?

The Young Parent School Program allows mothers and fathers who are 16-26 years of age to obtain credits for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) while in a supported learning environment with a caring teacher and Rose of Durham counsellors.

Who is Eligible for This Program?

If you are parenting or pregnant and:

- Between the ages of 16-26 years old and are registered with the Rose of Durham;
- Enrolled in Durham Catholic DSB alternative education or adult education school.

Students who are 16 and 17 years of age are registered with Father Donald MacLellan CSS. Students who are 18-26 years of age are registered in Adult Education with Archbishop Anthony Meagher CCEC.

(Cooperative Education)

The Work-4-Credits (Cooperative Education) Program provides employed adults who are unable to attend day school the opportunity to earn high school credits toward their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) while at work receiving pay.

- One credit can be earned for every 110 hours on the job
- Candidates must be over 18 years of age, not enrolled in a high school and currently employed
- Employees meet with the teacher of the Work-4-Credits program
- Credits are based on meeting job expectations and completing and submitting assignments to the cooperative education teacher

The Custodial Services Training Program is an 18-week program that is designed to prepare individuals with the skills necessary for entry-level custodial positions. Classroom time consists of learning safety practices and protocols, as well as the practical knowledge required for custodial services. Students can earn five high school credits and gain on-the-job experience.

Custodians are integral members of an organization. Their responsibilities provide staff with a safe, clean, and secure environment. Today's custodial profession requires a great deal of knowledge and skill. Custodians are extremely important to the running of an efficient organization and maintaining a healthy environment.



The Custodial Services Training Program has two parts:

Part 1 - In-School:

November 10, 2022 – January 23, 2023

Monday to Friday (8:30 a.m. – 1:30 p.m.) with a digital literacy component to enhance 21st century learning skills. Students can earn two credits for this component.

Part 2 – Job Placement:

January 24 – April 4, 2023

What is the Adult Dual Credit Program?

The Adult Dual Credit Program assists adult learners in the completion of their Ontario Secondary School Diploma and leads to successful transition to a college or apprenticeship program. Students who are accepted to the program attend classes through Durham College twice a week and Archbishop Anthony Meagher CCEC three days a week throughout the semester. During that time, they will work to complete their high school graduation requirements and take a college course taught by a Durham College faculty member, supported by a secondary teacher. If successful in the dual credit course, two credits are recorded: one on the high school transcript and the second on the college transcript.

Students are referred to the Centre for Success by their current home school. Students must be 17 years of age or older and are at risk of not graduating with his/her peers.
