Registration Information

- Adult Education courses and programs for high school credit are open to students 18 years of age or older who are not registered in a secondary school.
- Current transcript, photo identification and citizenship status are required to register.



Prior Learning Assessment & Recognition (PLAR) for Mature Students



What is PLAR?

Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) is the formal evaluation and credit granting process whereby mature students may obtain credits for prior learning. Prior learning includes the knowledge and skills that adults have gained, in both formal and informal ways, outside of secondary school.

Who can apply for a PLAR Assessment?

A mature student who is:

- 1. Turning 18 before August 31 of the current school year; and
- 2. Enrolled in a credit program for the purpose of obtaining an Ontario Secondary School Diploma.

Is there a cost?

There is no cost for the PLAR Assessment once a student is registered in a credit course or program.

Fast Track

The Fast Track program is designed for adult learners 18 years of age or older who are not currently enrolled in school who are interested in strengthening their academic skills and completing their high school diploma. Fast Track provides a supportive learning environment and intake process, with welcoming staff who can provide help with pathways planning and support the mature PLAR process.



The Young Parent School Program allows young and vulnerable parents to obtain credits for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) while in a supported learning environment with a caring teacher and Rose of Durham counsellors.

Who is Eligible for This Program?

- Individuals who are parenting or pregnant; and
- Registered with the Rose of Durham.

Once enrolled at the Rose of Durham, individuals will register with Durham Catholic District School Board Alternative Education or Adult Education.

The Child Care Assistant Training Program is an 18-week program designed to equip students with foundational knowledge in child development, child care legislation and child care programming. It also offers valuable hands-on experience through practical, on-the-job training.

Custodial Services Training Program

Employment Training Programs for Credit

Material Cost: \$450

This 18-week program is designed to equip individuals with the essential skills for entry-level custodial roles. Through a combination of classroom instruction and hands-on experience, students will learn industry-standard safety procedures, cleaning techniques, and maintenance protocols.

Participants can earn five high school credits while gaining valuable on-the-job training. Custodians play a vital role in maintaining safe, clean, and secure environments. As key members of any organization, their work supports the health and efficiency of the entire operation. Today's custodial professionals are highly skilled and knowledgeable, making them indispensable to organizational success.

Work-4-Credits (Cooperative Education)

High School Credit

The Work-4-Credits Program offers employed adults who are unable to attend day school the opportunity to earn high school credits toward their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)—all while working and earning a paycheck.

- Participants earn one credit for every 110 hours of paid employment.
- To qualify, individuals must be 18 years or older, not currently enrolled in high school, and employed within the Durham Region.
- The program features continuous intake, allowing participants to start at any time.

This flexible program is ideal for adults looking to complete their high school education while maintaining their employment toward their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)—all while working and earning a paycheck.



Students must be 18 years of age or older with a medical clearance from a doctor, two step TB test, flu shot, clear vulnerable sector criminal record check, pass a literacy test, have a successful personal interview, and show proof of residency status.

Orientation

Orientation is mandatory. You must register for the orientation online and write a literacy test in person. Successful candidates are required complete an interview prior to acceptance. Ajax and Oshawa Campus

The Pre-PSW program provides opportunities for students to strengthen their literacy skills and prepare for success in the Personal Support Worker program. Students who are working toward their Ontario Secondary School Diploma can also meet with a PLAR (Prior Learning and Recognition) assessor as part of the program.

Students must complete the program prior to the start of the PSW course.

Cost: Free

What is the Adult Dual Credit Program?

The Adult Dual Credit Program supports adult learners in completing their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) while easing their transition into college or apprenticeship pathways. Courses are delivered by a Durham College instructor, with additional support from a teacher at Archbishop Anthony Meagher CCEC.

Upon successful completion of a dual credit course, students receive two credits—one applied to their high school transcript and one to their college transcript.

Who is eligible for the Adult Dual Credit Program?

- Students who are enrolled in adult education
- Students interested in a college or apprenticeship program
- Students at both the Oshawa and Ajax Campuses


