Prior Learning Assessment & Recognition (PLAR) for Mature Students

Assessments for
High School Credits



What is PLAR?

Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) is the formal evaluation and credit granting process whereby mature students may obtain credits for prior learning. Prior learning includes the knowledge and skills that adults have gained, in both formal and informal ways, outside of secondary school.

Who can apply for a PLAR Assessment?

A mature student who is:

1. Turning 18 before August 31 of the current school year; and
2. Enrolled in a credit program for the purpose of obtaining an Ontario Secondary School Diploma.

Is there a cost?

There is no cost for the PLAR Assessment once a student is registered in a credit course or program.

Fast Track

High School Credits

The Fast Track program is designed for adult learners 18 years of age or older who are not currently enrolled in school who are interested in strengthening their academic skills and completing their high school diploma. Fast Track provides a supportive learning environment and intake process, with welcoming staff who can provide help with pathways planning and support the mature PLAR process.

Students will receive supports to:

- Complete one Learning Strategies credit
- Build skills required to successfully complete Mature PLAR assessments
- Be assessed for life and work experiences for Grade 11 and 12 credits
- Plan for College, Apprenticeship, Work or University

The Fast Track Program is continuous intake

Who is Eligible for This Program?

- Registered with the Rose of Durham.

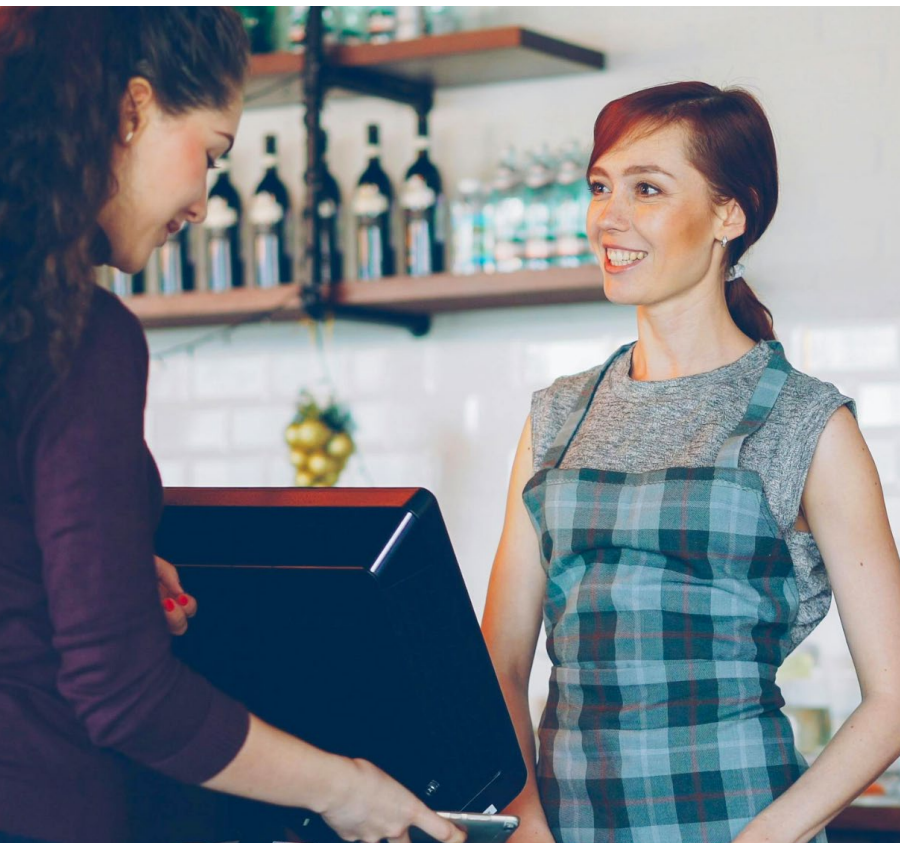
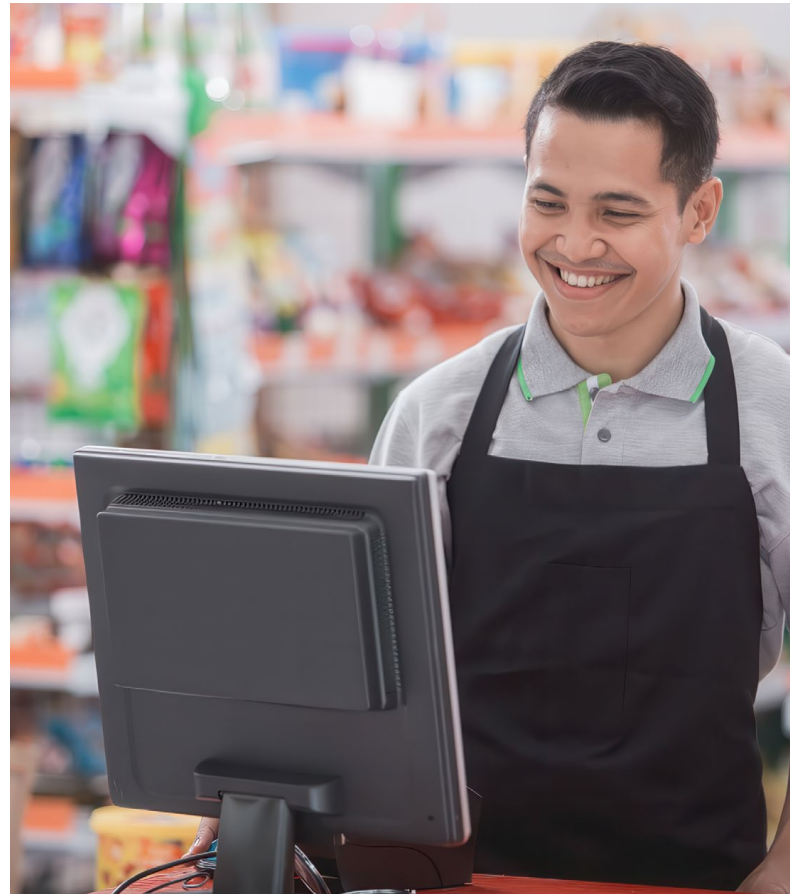


Are you currently employed, not able to attend classes, and interested in earning your high school diploma?

The Work-4-Credits Program offers employed adults who are unable to attend day school the opportunity to earn high school credits toward their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)—all while working and earning a paycheck.

- Participants earn one credit for every 110 hours of paid employment.
- To qualify, individuals must be 18 years or older, not currently enrolled in high school, and employed within the Durham Region.
- The program features continuous intake, allowing participants to start at any time.

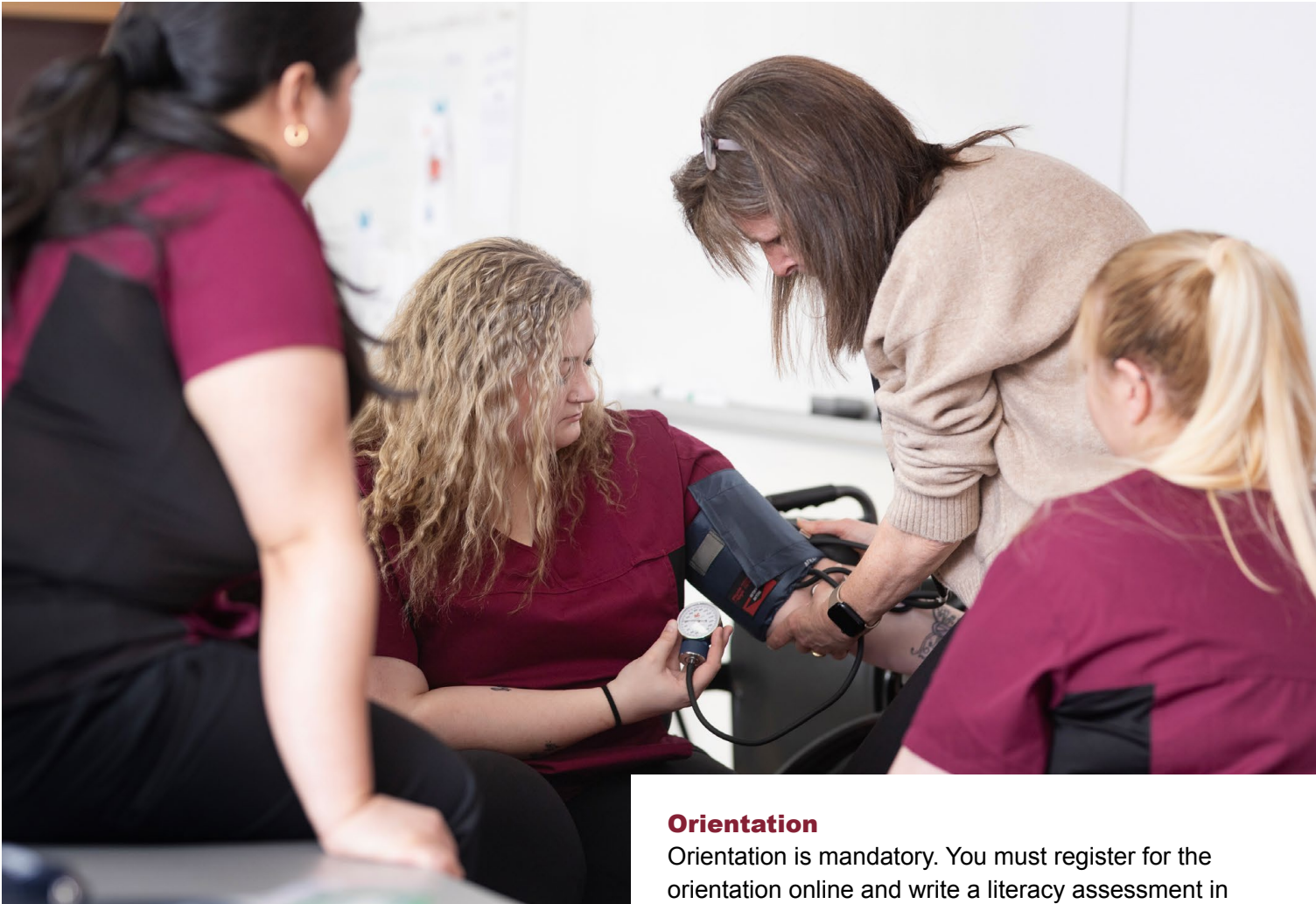

Orientation

Orientation is mandatory. You must register for the orientation online and write a literacy assessment in person. Successful candidates are required complete an interview prior to acceptance. What is the Adult Dual Credit Program?

The Adult Dual Credit Program supports adult learners in completing their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) while easing their transition into college or apprenticeship pathways. Courses are delivered by a Durham College instructor, with additional support from a teacher at Archbishop Anthony Meagher CCEC.

Upon successful completion of a dual credit course, students receive two credits—one applied to their high school transcript and one to their college transcript.

Who is eligible for the Adult Dual Credit Program?

- Students who are enrolled in adult education
- Students interested in a college or apprenticeship program
- Students at both the Oshawa and Ajax Campuses
